Maplewood K-8 Parent Cooperative and Madrona School
Entry Pool Guidelines
Revised 2011 (reviewed by School Board October 2011)

Families interested in enrolling their children at either of the two Choice Programs, (Maplewood K-8 or Madrona School) may place their children into the entry pool for that program. The following guidelines outline the specific rules surrounding entry. To inquire about your child's status on the entry pool, or to seek more information about the entry pool guidelines, please contact the respective school office.

Entry Pool

- In order to be placed in the entry pool, parents must first contact the school for a tour of the school. They will receive the entry pool placement form at the end of the tour.
- To qualify for the in-district entry pool, a student must be living with an adult who is the parent, legal guardian or foster parent with whom s/he is designated to live the majority of the time.
- The entry pools at Madrona and Maplewood will be inactive between July 1 and August 1 every year.
- It is the responsibility of the family to update changes in pertinent information with the manager of the entry pool.
- Once contacted and offered placement, a family will be given five school business days to make its decision. The entry pool manager will document the date and time of the initial and follow-up phone calls.
- The final date for enrolling children in a current year's class will be the last day of school before spring break. If openings develop after spring break, families will be called and offered placement for the following fall.
- Slots that become available during the school year will be filled first from a sibling lottery. When the sibling pool is exhausted at a grade level, the remainder of the available slots will be chosen by lottery.

Kindergarten

- Kindergarten positions not filled by siblings are determined by lottery in January/February for the following school year.
- Each year, five "alternates" will be selected by lottery and informed by the office manager of the entry pool. This enables families to plan ahead in case an opening occurs. These prioritized lists are valid only for the following school year.
- In preparation for the kindergarten lottery each year, the number of available seats, after sibling and staff member spots are filled,* will be divided into four pools, one for each quadrant of the District. The number of lottery drawings from each quadrant will be based on the percentage of the total enrollment of elementary students living in that quadrant. *Per state statute, full time, continuing contract employees may enroll their child(ren) at the employee's assigned school.
- If there are fewer students in any quadrant pool than seats available for that quadrant, those additional seats will be drawn from a pool of the total applicants remaining after all quadrant seats are filled. Students not selected for admissions in the kindergarten lottery may keep their names in the lottery pool for future openings.

Maplewood/Madrona Entry Pool Guidelines

Siblings

- In an attempt to provide all students within a family the opportunity to attend school together, siblings of current students who are residents of the school district have priority for entry provided the following conditions have been met.
- To qualify for sibling status a student must be living in the district with an adult who is the parent, legal guardian or foster parent with whom s/he is designated to live the majority of the time.
- Siblings of out-of-district students will not be placed in the sibling entry pool.

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- Parents or legal guardians must place siblings in the entry pool. If a family has one child in the school, the others are not put on the list automatically.
- A sibling must be in attendance at the school during the year in which a brother or sister who is requesting sibling status would enter the school if selected.
- Siblings of in-district students in the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program at Madrona, Maplewood 7-8 Vision Impaired program, and the Maplewood Center at Maplewood are eligible for the sibling entry pool.

District Employee Policy

- In accordance with RCW 28A.225.225 the children of staff members employed full time at the school, whether they live in or outside of the school district, may be enrolled at the school when space is available.
- Students of full time employees at the school may be enrolled prior to the use of the lottery process.
- Children of school district employees not working full time at the school must apply for admission according to the regular established guidelines.

Out of District

- Except for the children of staff members working full-time at the school, out of district students will be considered only when space is available at a specific grade level and when there are no in-district students seeking enrollment at that grade level.
- A separate out-of-district entry pool will be maintained of interested students.

Special Circumstances

- Families who leave the district may request a leave of absence. The principal will review leave requests. If approved, a student on leave may be placed in the sibling lottery pool should they return to a district residence within one calendar year.
- The district may place students in the Middle School Visually Impaired Program at Maplewood K-8.
- In order to qualify for enrollment, a student must meet entry age requirements or have qualified for early entrance under school district policy. Space will not be held for students who may be considering early entrance.
- If a student, who has qualified for early entrance and has been selected for the program, decides not to enroll at that time, or after the 25 day evaluation period is determined to not be ready for kindergarten or first grade, the student may be placed back in the entry pool for the following year.
- Kindergarten students who are selected, but who decide not to enroll at the regular time, are placed back in the pool for the following year.
- Students currently enrolled at the schools will not be retroactively impacted by 2010 procedure changes.

ENTRY POOL

In order to be placed in the entry pool, parents must first contact the school for a tour of the school. They will receive the entry pool placement form at the end of the tour.

To qualify for the in-district entry pool, a student must be living with an adult who is the parent, legal guardian or foster parent with whom s/he is designated to live the majority of the time.

The entry pool at Madrona will be inactive between July 1 and August 1 every year. The entry pool at Maplewood will be inactive between July 1 and August 15 every year.

It is the responsibility of the family to update changes in pertinent information with the manager of the entry pool.

Once contacted and offered placement, a family will be given five school business days to make its decision. The entry pool manager will document the date and time of the initial phone call. In the event that a wrong number is listed or phone messages are not returned promptly, a letter will be sent offering placement with a five day deadline to respond.

The final date for enrolling children in a current year's class will be the last day of school before spring break. If openings develop after spring break, families will be called and offered placement for the following fall.

Students will be offered placement first from the sibling list. When the sibling list is exhausted at a grade level, the remainder of the available slots will be chosen by lottery.

Students on the rank-ordered lists as of September 3, 1998 will remain on the list in the position in which they now appear. This list is relatively small in 2002.

If a family on the rank order list is offered placement and declines, they will be placed in the lottery entry pool unless they have sibling status.

KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten positions not filled by siblings are determined by lottery in January for the following school year.

Each year, five "alternates" will be selected by lottery and informed by the manager of the entry pool. This enables families to plan ahead in case an opening occurs. These prioritized lists are valid only for the following school year.

SIBLINGS

In an attempt to provide all students within a family the opportunity to attend school together, siblings of current students who are residents of the school district have priority for entry provided the following conditions have been met.

To qualify for sibling status a student must be living in the district with an adult who is the parent, legal guardian or foster parent with whom s/he is designated to live the majority of the time. Siblings of out-of-district students will not be placed in the sibling entry pool.

The selection of siblings will be by lottery after the current rank order sibling list is exhausted. After May 1, 2002, all siblings will be placed in the sibling lottery pool. Siblings on the rank order list before May 1, 2002 will be rank ordered as of the date the sibling's name was

entered into that pool. If a sibling in the rank order pool is offered placement at any time and declines, his/her name may remain in the sibling lottery pool but will no longer receive rank order priority.

Parents or legal guardians must place siblings in the entry pool. If a family has one child in the school, the others are not put on the list automatically.

A sibling must be in attendance at the school during the year in which a brother or sister who is requesting sibling status would enter the school if selected.

Siblings of in-district students in the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program at Madrona and the Maplewood Center at Maplewood are eligible for the sibling entry pool.

DISTRICT EMPLOYEE POLICY

Children of staff members, who are employed full time at the school, will be enrolled at that school when space is available.

OUT OF DISTRICT

Children of families living outside of the Edmonds School District may be placed in a separate out-of-district entry pool.

The out-of-district entry pool will be used only if there are no in-district students in the regular entry pool for a given grade level. If the student documents a move into the district s/he may move to the district entry pool.

Students who live outside of the district will be placed in the out-of-district entry pool each year of their enrollment at the school and continued enrollment is subject to space available in the program each year.

Any student placed in the program whose residence changes to outside the Edmonds School District after September 1 may stay in the program for the remainder of the current school year. Documentation of the date of move is required. Continued placement at the school each year is dependent on the out-of-district entry pool guidelines. (Also see sibling guidelines.)

SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

Families who leave the district may request a leave of absence. The principal will review leave requests. If approved, a student on leave may be placed in the sibling lottery pool when they return to the district.

The district may place students in either program through the Readmissions process in place in the district.

The district may place students in the Middle School Visually Impaired Program at Maplewood K-8.

In order to qualify for enrollment, a student must meet entry age requirements or have qualified for early entrance under school district policy. Space will not be held for students who may be considering early entrance.

If a student, who has qualified for early entrance and has been selected for the program, decides not to enroll at that time, the student may be placed back in the entry pool for the following year.

Kindergarten students who are selected, but who decide not to enroll at the regular time, are placed back in the pool for the following year.
